

Spa design is honored

GGLO Architecture and Interior Design was recently awarded "First Place for Service Retailer Design" in the International Store Design competition organized by The Institute of Store Planners and VM+SD magazine. The award-winning project is Ummelina International Day Spa and Global Remedies, owned by Nina Ummel. The 5,000-square-foot spa, located at 1525 Fourth Ave. in downtown Seattle, leads the "traveler" through beauty and health rituals from around the world. The design supplemented natural light and incorporated stone, metals, glass, concrete and natural fibers in the environment. Other elements include stained concrete, salvaged wood timbers and polished terrazzo floors. Furniture was selected by Trina Haines Prawat of Savvy, Inc. and Nina Ummel. Casework was designed by Mag Secretario. GGLO is now working in a 1,500-square-foot expansion to the spa.
